

IMPACT 2020: INTRODUCTION TO COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

PROGRAM OVERVIEW



Impact 2020: Introduction to Community Engagement is a three-day foundational program that connects students across the country who are eager to learn how they can become active and involved members in their communities. Over the course of the three days, students will participate in a variety of virtual activities to explore their sense of purpose, develop leadership skills, and think critically about social and political issues that matter most to them. Students will leave the program equipped with a better understanding of issues affecting their communities and an action plan to advocate for impactful changes.

Each session is facilitated by trained Close Up Instructors:

Day 1: Understanding the Issues

To help students understand issues affecting their communities, this session will focus on the designs of neighborhoods, the systems in place to support residents in the area, and how those systems can sometimes lead to areas of inequity and gaps in opportunity.

Day 2: Advocacy and Leadership

After exploring issues in their communities, students are guided through a series of activities aimed at developing their sense of purpose and what leadership skills and advocacy strategies they can employ to make change in their communities.

Day 3: Designing Action Plans

In small groups, students will engage in a “design-thinking” activity that will help them develop a personal action plan for bringing about change in their own communities on the issues that matter most to them.
